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AIDS FUND IS HOSTING AN “ART & SOLE” BOOK SIGNING AND SHOPPING EVENT



The perfect book for shoe lovers, fashionistas, and art aficionados, **Jane Gershon Weitzman’s “Art & Sole”** features shoes made from highly unique materials—feathers, papers, ceramic, metal, resin, playing cards, corrugated cardboard, Swarovski crystals, even fresh flowers and frosting—and their intricate construction is remarkable.

Jane Gershon Weitzman was the executive vice president of Stuart Weitzman and the first vice president of Stuart Weitzman Retail. She spearheaded philanthropy for the company by generating

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funds to support breast and ovarian cancer research and awareness. Her efforts were brought to life through innovative charity events on the brand's website, such as the Stuart Weitzman Celebrity Breast Cancer Shoe Auction, and its retail stores. She serves on the Trust Board of the Boston Children's Hospital.

As a painter, **Kevin O'Brien**'s goals were to add beauty to the world and meaning to his own life. O'Brien believes that "with beauty and meaning, inspiration comes naturally, often, and from everywhere." O'Brien's start was in painting but he quickly realized that novice artists had a hard time selling their work. A friend suggested he get some silk to use as a canvas that she would then sell as a scarf. He promptly went to purchase some polyester instead of silk, painted it, and was able to get Barneys of New York to place and order. From there, Kevin O'Brien Studio was born. Today, with real silk and the help of a handful of trusted collaborators and employees, the studio creates some of the most elegantly unique, beautiful decorative pillows, scarves, and bedding in the industry.
